Position Description: Represent ADOT's position/interests at hazardous materials and other emergencies and/or drills/exercises. Represents ADOT's interests when 3rd parties spill hazardous materials on ADOT property or right of way. Manages the statewide ADOT Hazardous Communication Program. Maintains ADOT's hazardous materials and CDL hazardous materials endorsement training programs. Individual must be available for call back 24 hrs per day and must be available to travel. Position makes decisions on response and clean up requirements for ADOT property and right of way. This includes communication with the responsible party, cleanup contractors, regulators, responders and other entities to make decisions in the best interest of the agency.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Knowledge of the principles and practices of hazardous materials management as it applies to emergency response and transportation activities;
- Knowledge of federal and state statues such as OSHA, RCRA, DOT Hazardous Materials, DOT FMCSA (Federal Motor Carrier Safety Act), EPA, EPCRA, SARA III, and Petroleum Contaminated Soils relating to hazardous materials/waste use, transportation, storage and disposal;
- Knowledge of methods, procedures, equipment, and techniques used in testing soil, air and water;
- Knowledge of safety practices, procedures and equipment used when responding to Hazardous Materials incidents per OSHA 1910.120, NIOSH, and NFPA;
- Ability to communicate effectively verbally and in writing; and
- Skill and/or knowledge of the use of Microsoft Office to include Word, PowerPoint, Excel, Outlook Calendar and E-Mail, and Access Database.

Ideal Candidate:

- Arizona Hazardous Materials Technician, or Hazardous Materials Technician according to NFPA 472 and/or OSHA 1910.120(q) or equivalent;
- Prefer an associates or bachelors degree in environmental science or closely related field;
- Five years experience of hazardous materials incident response in the public or private sector. One year of specialized education in hazardous materials, safety, or other related discipline may count for one year of experience.
